The GCV celebrated this anniversary with record ticket sales, fabulous publicity, an anniversary-themed Symposium, and a General Assembly commendation. Since the 1920s, The GCV has restored or enhanced more than 50 publicly accessible historic gardens and landscapes across the Commonwealth. No other organization raises monies from a house and garden tour and puts them back into the ground

icket sales for Historic Garden Week 2008 topped \$800,000 for the most financially successful Garden Week ever. Internet ticket income tripled, and HGW "went global," with international publicity for the program's 75th anniversary. The GCV and our restoration

programs were front and center in the public eye. Two new restoration projects were presented in September 2007, one at Historic St. Luke's Church in Isle of Wight

County and the other at the Yeardley Garden at Jamestown, in time for Jamestown's gala 400th anniversary and a visit by the Queen. The 2008 Rudy I. Favretti Historic Landscape
