Overall awards

The Nobel Prize

to be awarded to the best horticulture exhibit in the show from amongst all the blue ribbon winners.

Novice Award

to be awarded to the best horticulture exhibit in the show from amongst the novice entries. A novice is an exhibitor who has not won a blue ribbon at any GCV show in the horticulture division.

Propagation Award

to be awarded to the best horticulture exhibit in the show that was propagated by the exhibitor. The entry must have been awarded a first, second or third place ribbon. A detailed explanation of the propagation method should accompany the entry.

Sweepstakes Award

to be awarded to the club with the highest number of points earned. Points are awarded as follows:

Special award	10 points
First place	4 points
Second place	3 points
Third place	2 points
Honorable mention	1 point
Commendation	1 point

The Linnaeus Award

Carl Linnaeus was a Swedish botanist known as the father of modern taxonomy. He formalized the modern system of naming organisms called binomial nomenclature.

to be awarded to the best collection from amongst the blue ribbon winners in the collection classes.

The Dahl Award

Anders Dahl was a Swedish botanist and student of Carl Linnaeus. The dahlia flower is named after him.

to be awarded to the club with the most entries amongst all of the horticulture classes.

The Potter Award

Helen Beatrix Potter was an English author, illustrator, natural scientist and conservationist. In addition to her famous children's books, Potter was an avid botanist.

all guests, members, exhibitors, judges, passers and clerks may cast one vote for their favorite exhibit in the show.

Judges Commendation

may be awarded to an entry or a class, section or other aspect of the show that is of exceptional merit.

awarded to the best perennial grown for bloom (classes 3-15)

The Nitrogen Award

awarded to the best perennial grown for foliage (classes 16-24)

The Oxygen Award

awarded to the best annual (classes 25-36)

The Phosphorus Award

awarded to the best dahlia (classes 37-49)

The Sulfur Award

awarded to the best flowering, berried, seeded or fruited
branches of trees or shrubs (class 50-54)

awarded to the best Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora or their climbing
sports - bloom or spray. (class 62 & class 63)

Edith Farr Elliott Memorial Award

awarded to the best Floribunda and their climbing sports - bloom

Elizabeth Campbell Wright Perpetual Trophy

awarded to the best Polyantha sprays or their climbing sports
(class 66)

Captain and Mrs. Edgar M. Williams Trophy

awarded to the best modern shrub (class 67)

Bernice S. Walker Perpetual Trophy

awarded to the best miniature (class 68)

Pat Wade Taylor Miniflora Award

awarded to the best miniflora (class 69)

Yancie Donegan Casey Memorial Award

awarded to the best fragrant rose (class 70)

Benjamin F. Parrott Cup

awarded to the best novice exhibit (class 71)

Mary Jean Printz Award

awarded to the best inter-club entry of six Hybrid Teas or Grandifloras (class 72)

F. Whitney Godwin Memorial Trophy

awarded to the best inter-club entry of three sprays (class 73)

Dr. and Mrs. James R. Hundley Trophy

This award was given in 2005 by the Garden Club of the Northern Neck in honor of the Hundleys and in recognition of the many contributions made during the eight years that Charlotte served as Rose Chairman for the Garden Club of Virginia. It is to be awarded to a member of the Garden Club of Virginia winning the greatest number of blue ribbons in the rose classes, except the novice class. Special awards are given the value of an additional blue ribbon. In case of a tie, red ribbons will be counted.
